"LOUDEST SILENT FILM" TO HOLD UK PREMIERE IN HULL

- Modern silent film Tuvalu to be presented with new electronic rock score by Croatian artists Mr Lee & IvaneSky
- People of Hull are invited to become part of the band through unique water-themed instruments and digital interaction

Hull is invited to set sail on a unique adventure into film and music as a ground-breaking water-themed live event comes to the city for its UK premiere. Combining film, live music and audience participation, the silent film *Tuvalu* with be presented at Fruit on Thursday 9th November with musicians travelling from Croatia to present the unique performance utilising empty water bottles as instruments,

Tuvalu, a modern silent film by German director Veit Helmer, receives a brand new soundtrack to be performed live by Mr Lee & IvaneSky, the collaboration of two of Croatia's leading musical artists Damir Martinović "Mrle" (frontman of Croatian rock pioneers Let 3) and Ivanka Mazurkijević. The band are looking for volunteers to accompany them by playing their unusual handmade instruments, and all attendees will be able to be part of the score using their mobile phones, with interactive elements that will cue the audience to help create the soundtrack through cheering, clapping, gargling water and more...

The Hull show will be only the second time the live soundtrack has been performed in the world, with the world premiere taking place at the 20th Motovun Film Festival in Croatia in July 2017.

The film *Tuvalu* is previously unreleased in the UK, and the screening is a must-see for fans of classic silent films as well as modern hits such as the Oscar-winning The Artist. Unlike the traditional presentation of silent films with piano accompaniment, this production fuses popular,

contemporary music and the latest technology to create an entirely new experience for film and music lovers.

Lisa Brook, Director of Live Cinema UK said: 'We are so excited to be bringing this unique project to Hull. You might not have heard of Mr Lee & IvaneSky, but if you like Arcade Fire, British Sea Power, or Sigur Ros, you'll want to get this show on your must-see list. *Tuvalu* is unlike anything you will have seen before: seeing this new live score is like going to a gig, AND watching a film at the same time. Plus if you've ever wanted to be part of a band but have no musical talent, now is your chance!'

Sam Hunt, Executive Producer at Hull UK City of Culture 2017, said: "This special screening of *Tuvalu* is a fantastic addition to the wide-ranging programme film activity that has been taking place in Hull throughout 2017. It promises to be quite a ride, bringing together film and the live concert experience. It'll be an unforgettable night."

About Mr Lee & IvaneSky

Damir Martinović Mrle has been a musician, author and performer for thirty years. He has had a punk/ rock history and recorded around twenty albums in his native language and is the author of the music both for Let3 and MrLee & IvaneSky. His work in theater and performance art made him popular especially for his unique musical combination of rock, punk, pop, ethno, electronic and provocative styles as well as for new sounds. As an artist he is very much involved in performing reactionary music connected to the social moments of his immediate society. In recent years he became an author of film music which received many awards. The last movie *Kauboji* was Croatia's nomination for the 2013 Oscars.

Ivanka Mazurkijević is the other half of Mr Lee & IvaneSky and has been a performer, singer and author for twenty years. She has recorded ten albums and cooperated with many famous musicians in her native Croatia. In her music she likes to mix styles from old musicals, cabaret and retro pop rock as well as some children chants from South American music and jazz. This project has been defined as "LeelaCountyglam" by some music journalists.

For the last ten years she has made music for over twenty plays and three films and she has also won many awards on various film festivals, theater festivals as well as music awards. She also has a bend in Berlin ("La Folee") and works, records and performs in Italy (Theater house in Prato and Spoleto).
